Government absent, school stops on 10 December

The mobilization has been proclaimed by Flc Cgil, Uil scuola, Snals-Confsal and Gilda Unams. Contract, precarious, classes on strike for the reasons of the strike. Sinopoli: this executive has decided to disinvest in public education

No opening or step forward in the negotiations. And so also the attempt of conciliation provided by the contract – after the proclamation of the state of agitation of the past week – has failed. The school will go on strike on **10 December**, as announced in the press conference of today (24 November) by Flc Cgil, Uil scuola, Snals-Confsal and Gilda Unams.

In short, as the unions write in a note, the administration has done nothing "to try to give answers to the school staff, leaving the school without a negotiating table for the renewal of the contract and without resources for increases of three digits as promised by the same minister. On the other hand, an unsatisfactory "we will look for resources", which is not sufficient to stop the protest, since no defined "né capitoli di spesa, né possibili incrementi" and that "no normative solution, not even at zero cost, is presented", except a generic commitment to continue with the meetings.

"We ask for 'resources' and receive 'tables'. There are concrete signals, not openings of dialogue – have commented the secretaries of the organizations – because the dialogue with the minister has always been frank and open and has never been interrupted, but now there are measures that give value to the school, dignity of the professional staff."

Measures that in the budget law are not there. The one that is grave is that in the Pact for education, signed last spring, 21 points were dedicated to the centrality of the school and it was promised interventions – among other things – on salaries, classes on strike and stabilization of the precarious. For Francesco Sinopoli, general secretary of Flc Cgil, "this strike marks a turning point in the relationship with the government. But the responsibility is all on the government itself, which has made a choice: disinvest in the school, as has happened in the last 15 years, but to make this decision even more odious, after two years of pandemic and with all the rhetoric on the centrality of the school public".

On the proclamation of the strike, the unions have indicated five central themes. The first concerns the **contractual renewal**. They would receive 350 euros a month to catch up with the European average, but in Finance there are only 87 plus 12 euros to reward a not very well defined "professional dedication" and therefore not for all. An insulting language, beyond the misery of the foreseen funding, practically a handout. Then there is the question of the **organic covid**, used during the pandemic to guarantee safety measures in schools and to stop the classes that are too numerous and that have been prorogated only for teachers, excluding the **personnel Ata**. On the **precarious personnel**, and on the need to stabilize it as we often remember the EU, no comparison has been made yet. The Pact for the School signed in April contains measures that go in that direction but to this Pact no follow-up has been given.

Also on **classes that are too numerous** no **practical** measures have been provided, as well as on technical issues that are apparently fundamental for the functioning of the school and the dignity of the people. Measures linked to professional situations such as those of the administrative managers, or related to the work of the personnel such as the block of mobility by law, instead of being regulated by contract, are two examples of measures that can be taken at zero cost.

In short: **the reasons for which the school is not here** – significant also the occupations of the students in these days – are really many. And when there is no dialogue, the conflict remains the only possible response.
